

## President's Awards for Excellence in Teaching

Nomination Deadline: January 5

The President's Awards for Excellence in Teaching program provides recognition for faculty who have made outstanding contributions to teaching at Wayne State University. This year, the award program will consist of up to ten awards. Each of the awards will provide a cash award of \$2,500, and a plaque is presented to each awardee.

The Awards will be presented to outstanding faculty who, to an exceptionally high degree, demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of their subject, superior classroom performance, and high educational standards; communicate their subject matter accurately, clearly, and effectively; generate enthusiasm and respect for learning; motivate their students to excel; and are accessible to students. Consideration also will be given to innovative instructional practices, impact on teaching at Wayne State University, and contributions to advancing teaching in their field.

All full-time and part-time faculty members who have taught for at least three consecutive years are eligible to be nominated for this award. Faculty members who have won the award during the previous five years are not eligible for this year's awards.

Nominations must be submitted by the department chair or program director using the attached form. Nominations must also include letters of support from faculty and students, the nominee's teaching portfolio (including a statement of teaching philosophy), a summary of the Student Evaluation of Teaching data, and a current Professional Record. Please limit the nomination package to 20 pages (not including the Professional Record and the Letters of Support from Faculty and Students). Review committees are composed of faculty from diverse disciplines. Therefore, please write for highly educated professionals outside your discipline. Successful applications are crafted specifically to the award, and include subheadings aligned with the rubric criteria.

Recipients will be notified in March. The recipients of the Awards will be selected by a committee consisting of five faculty members and a student, chaired by a designee from the Provost's Office.

- Faculty and student letters of support (maximum five total at least two from faculty colleagues)
- Nominee's Teaching Portfolio that includes a statement of teaching philosophy; descriptions of innovation in such areas as instructional design, delivery, and course management; and evidence of impact on teaching in the nominee's field.
- A Summary of Student Evaluation of Teaching data for the last three years. The summary table must be in the standard, certified University format (SET004 Longitudinal Report).
- Current WSU Professional Record
- A draft citation for the award ceremony booklet of approximately 250 words, avoiding the use of direct quotes from letters or reviewers.
- Please upload each nomination and all supporting materials as a single bookmarked PDF by January
