

Thirty year trends in higher education show an increase in non-tenure line faculty across the nation. Against that backdrop, Dr. Russel y Rodríguez will bring to the surface the particular ways in which non-tenure line faculty are deployed and how the framing of non-tenured work rely on a specifically gendered reading of productive/reproductive labor.

Based on her experience as a non-tenure eligible faculty and as a faculty administrator, she will bring to the foreground ideologies, assumptions, and languages we use that unwittingly draw upon gendered and racial assumptions of power (and pay) and, in doing so, unsettle our own practices.
