ELIGIBILITY

Wayne State University evaluates candidates through a holistic admission process. To be eligible for Wayne Med-Direct consideration, you must:

- Have a minimum 3.5 GPA and 1310 SAT or 28 ACT score
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- · Be an incoming first-year student

Preference will be given to students from disadvantaged socioeconomic backgrounds who are interested in studying health disparities.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

By Dec. 1:

- Complete the Wayne State University undergraduate admission application
- Submit official high school transcripts
- Submit official SAT or ACT scores
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Complete the Wayne Med-Direct additional application
 - Three letters of recommendation
 - Two personal statements


